That's why the Pure Water Partners Program was proactively formed to safeguard watershed health as our region's population grows and we experience increased natural disasters, like the Holiday Farm Fire and extreme droughts.tt



Each property has unique characteristics. The PWP team can help you by:

- Assessing your property to recommend improvements, particularly along streamsides.
- Designing restoration projects on streambanks and recommending invasive vegetation management practices.
- Giving you tips for watershed-friendly and fire-resilient landscaping practices.
- Providing financial incentives to maintain healthy riparian habitats.
- Sharing resources including native plant, fire-resilient landscaping, and invasive plant management guides.
- Connecting you to other programs offering additional assistance.
